Thursday, June 13, and Friday, June 14 will both be half days for students (12:05 dismissal). This also means that there will be no aftercare for students on either day.

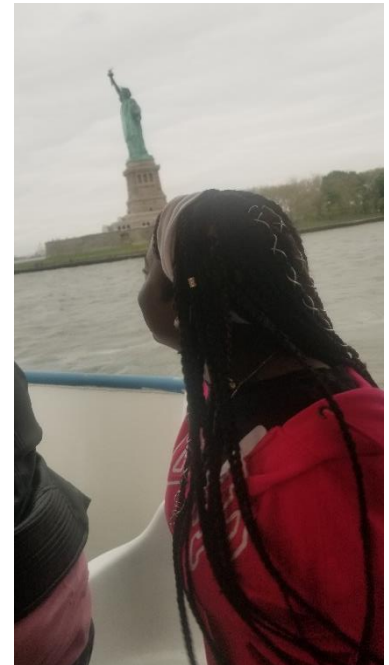
Community Peace Walk

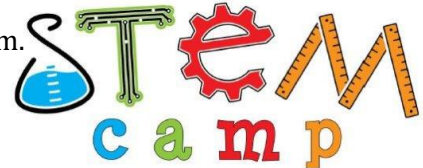


STEM Camp Opportunity
